Narrative Lectionary 2018-19

Readings for Year 1 (Matthew)

The **preaching texts** are always listed first. During the fall, Old Testament texts are the primary vehicle for proclaiming the biblical story. The gospel readings become primary texts on the Fourth Sunday of Advent. A brief accompanying reading (selected from one of the gospels before Christmas and after Easter; selected from Psalms from Christmas through Easter) is noted in parentheses. *These accompanying readings are optional*.

September	23	Joseph in Prison Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Genesis 39:1-23 Joseph is unjustly put in prison; yet God is present with him there (Matt 5:11-12, Blessed are you when people revile you)
September	30	Rescue at the Sea Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Exodus 14:5-7, 10-14, 21-29 The sea parts at the exodus; God's deliverance (Matt 2:13-15, Mary, Joseph, and Jesus in Egypt, out of Egypt have I called my son)
October	7	Covenant and Commandments Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost	Exodus 19:3-7; 20:1-17 God brings Israel as on eagle's wings; Decalogue (Matt 5:17, Jesus came not to abolish the law and prophets but to fulfill them)
October	14	Joshua Renews the Covenant Twenty-first Sunday after Pentecost	Joshua 24:1-15 [16-26] Story of God's deliverance. Joshua says, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord" (Matt 4:8-10, Satan offers Jesus all kingdoms, but Jesus says "Worship God and serve only him")
