Narrative Lectionary 2024-25

Readings for Year 3 (Luke)

The **preaching texts** are always listed first. Old Testament texts are the primary vehicle for proclaiming the biblical story until the Fourth Sunday of Advent, when the gospel readings become primary texts. An optional accompanying reading (selected from the gospels before Christmas and after Easter; from Psalms Christmas through Easter) is noted in parentheses.

September	8	NL301: Creation and Fall Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Genesis 2:4b-7, 15-17; 3:1-8 (Luke 11:4) Creation, Garden of Eden, fall into sin.
September	15	NL302: God's Promise to Abraham Seventeenth Sunday after Pentecost	Genesis 15:1-6 (Luke 3:8) God promises Abraham descendants as numerous as the stars. Abraham believes.
September	22	NL303: God Works through Joseph Eighteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Genesis 37:3-8, 17b-22, 26-34; 50:15-21 (Luke 6:35) Joseph's dreams lead to family conflict and he is sold into slavery. In the end Joseph forgives. God works for good.
September	29	NL304: The Promise of Passover Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost	Exodus 12:1-13; 13:1-8 (Luke 22:14-20) Passover: the blood of the lamb and unleavened bread signify God's sacrifice of the lamb God's deliverance.
October	6	NL305: Golden Calf Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost	Exodus 32:1-14 (Luke 23:34) Golden calf shows unfaithfulness at Mt. Sinai. Moses intercedes, God forgives.
October	13	NL306: God Answers Hannah Twenty-first Sunday after Pentecost	1 Samuel 1:9-11, 19-20; 2:1-10 (Luke 1:46-55) Samuel is God's answer to Hannah, who sings of God's care for the needy.

October	20	NL307: God's Promise to David Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost	2 Samuel 7:1-17 (Luke 1:30-33) God's promise to David concerning his heir, who will be God's Son and whose kingdom will endure forever.
October	27	NL308: Solomon Dedicates the Temple Twenty-third Sunday after Pentecost (or Reformation)	1 Kings 5:1-5; 8:27-30, 41-43 (Luke 19:45-46) Solomon fulfills the promise and builds the temple, a place of prayer for all nations
November	3	NL309: God's Care for the Widow Twenty-fourth Sunday after Pentecost (or All Saints)	1 Kings 17:1-16 [17-24] (Luke 4:24-26) Elijah and the widow; God's care for those on the margin.
November	10	NL310: Jonah and God's Mercy Twenty-fifth Sunday after Pentecost	Jonah 1:1-17; 3:1-10 [4:1-11] (Luke 18:13) Jonah's attempted escape from God, God's mercy on the people of Nineveh.
November	17	NL311: God Calls Isaiah Twenty-sixth Sunday after Pentecost	Isaiah 6:1-8 (Luke 5:8-10) Call of Isaiah: Holy, holy, holy is God; the prophet's sin, cleansing, and sending.
November	24	NL312: God Promises a New Covenant Christ the King / Reign of Christ Sunday	Jeremiah 36:1-8, 21-23, 27-28; 31:31-34 (Luke 22:19-20) Jeremiah's scroll calls for repentance, but the king burns it. The prophet promises a new covenant, written on the heart.
December	1	NL313: Daniel's Hope in God First Sunday of Advent	Daniel 6:6-27 (Luke 23:1-5) Daniel in the lions' den; deliverance; God's kingdom shall never be destroyed.

December	8	NL314: Joel: God's Promised Spirit	Joel 2:12-13, 28-29 (Luke 11:13)
		Second Sunday of Advent	Turn to a merciful God, promise of the Spirit.
December	15	NL315: Spirit of the Lord upon Me	Isaiah 61:1-11 (Luke 4:16-21)
		Third Sunday of Advent	The Spirit of the Lord is upon me to bring good news, liberty, and to make an everlasting covenant.
December	22	NL316: Jesus' Birth Announced	Luke 1:26-45 [46-56] (Psalm 113)
		Fourth Sunday of Advent	Announcement of Jesus' birth to Mary; he will receive the throne of David.
December	24	NL317: Birth of Jesus	Luke 2:1-14 [15-20] (Psalm 96)
		Christmas Eve	Birth of Jesus.
December	25	NL318: Shepherds Visit	Luke 2:8-20 (Psalm 123:1-2)
		Christmas Day	Shepherds visit the infant Jesus.
December	29	NL319: Simeon and Anna First Sunday of Christmas	Luke 2:21-38 (Psalm 131)
		Table Summary of Children	Simeon and Anna, Lord now you let your servant depart in peace.
January	5	NL320: Boy in the Temple Second Sunday of Christmas	Luke 2:41-52 (Psalm 2:7-8)
		Second Sunday of Christmas	Jesus in the temple at age twelve. He is in "his Father's house."
January	12	NL321: Jesus' Baptism	Luke 3:1-22 (Psalm 51:6-17)
		Baptism of Our Lord	John baptizes, bear fruit worthy of repentance, share what you have.
January	19	NL322: Sermon at Nazareth	Luke 4:14-30 (Psalm 146)
		Second Sunday after Epiphany	Sermon at Nazareth (Isaiah fulfilled, Elijah and widow, Elisha and Naaman).

January	26	NL323: Fish for People	Luke 5:1-11 (Psalm 90:14-17)
		Third Sunday after Epiphany	Great catch of fish, Peter will fish for people.
February	2	NL324: Healing on the Sabbath	Luke 6:1-16 (Psalm 92)
		Fourth Sunday after Epiphany	Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath (plucking grain, healing a man) and call of disciples.
February	9	NL325: Raising the Widow's Son	Luke 7:1-17 (Psalm 119:105-107)
		Fifth Sunday after Epiphany	Healing the centurion's slave by a word and raising the widow's son at Nain.
February	16	NL326: More than a	Luke 7:18-35 (Psalm 146:5-10)
		Prophet Sixth Sunday after Epiphany	Tell John what you see and hear
February	23	NL327: Forgiven at Jesus' Feet	Luke 7:36-50 (Psalm 103:3-6)
		Seventh Sunday after Epiphany	Sinful woman weeps at Jesus' feet and is forgiven
March	2	NL329: Transfiguration	Luke 9:28-45 (Psalm 36:5-10)
		Transfiguration of Our Lord	Transfiguration, healing a boy with a demon, passion prediction.
March	5	NL330: Jesus Turns to Jerusalem	Luke 9:51-62 (Psalm 5:7-8)
		Ash Wednesday	Jesus starts for Jerusalem, rejected in Samaria, Don't put your hand to the plow and turn back.
March	9	NL331: Good Samaritan	Luke 10:25-42 (Psalm 15)
		First Sunday in Lent	Parable of the Good Samaritan

March	16	NL332: Lament over Jerusalem Second Sunday in Lent	Luke 13:1-9, 31-35 (Psalm 122) The tower in Siloam and need for repentance, parable of fig tree that bore no fruit, lament over Jerusalem.
March	23	NL333: Lost Sheep, Coin, Son Third Sunday in Lent	Luke 15:1-32 (Psalm 119:167-176) Parables of lost sheep, coin, prodigal son.
March	30	NL334: Rich Man and Lazarus Fourth Sunday in Lent	Luke 16:19-31 (Psalm 41:1-3) Parable of the rich man and Lazarus.
April	6	NL335: Zacchaeus Fifth Sunday in Lent	Luke 18:31—19:10 (Psalm 84:1-4, 10-12) Healing a blind man, meeting Zacchaeus. Jesus came to seek and save the lost.
April	13	NL336: Triumphal Entry Palm/Passion Sunday	Luke 19:29-44 (<i>Psalm 118:19-23</i>) Triumphal entry; Jesus weeps over the city that does not know peace.
April	17	NL337: Last Supper Maundy Thursday	Luke 22:1-27 (Psalm 34:8-10) Preparation for the Last Supper, Words of Institution, Jesus is one who serves.
April	18	NL338: Crucifixion Good Friday	Luke 23:32-47 (Psalm 31:5-13) Crucifixion, Father forgive them; today in Paradise; into your hands I commend my Spirit.
April	20	NL339: Resurrection Resurrection of Our Lord	Luke 24:1-12 (Psalm 118:17, 21-24) Empty tomb, women perplexed, bring the message.

April	27	NL340: Emmaus Road	Luke 24:13-35 (Psalm 30)
		Second Sunday of Easter	"Our hearts burned along the road, as he opened to us the Scriptures."
May	4	NL341: Stephen's Witness	Acts 6:1—7:2a, 44-60 (Luke 23:33-34a, 46)
		Third Sunday of Easter	Controversy in the early church; some set aside for service. Stephen forgives and is martyred.
May	11	NL342: Ethiopian Eunuch Baptized	Acts 8:26-39 (Luke 24:44-47)
		Fourth Sunday of Easter	Ethiopian reads the Scriptures, comes to believe and be baptized by Philip.
May	18	NL343: Council at Jerusalem	Acts 15:1-18 (Luke 2:29-32)
		Fifth Sunday of Easter	Council at Jerusalem, Faith gives identity to both Jews and Gentiles.
May	25	NL344: Living by Faith	Galatians 1:13-17; 2:11-21 (Luke 18:9-14)
		Sixth Sunday of Easter	Paul's former life; conflict with Peter at Antioch; justification by faith.
June	1	NL345: One in Christ	Galatians 3:1-9, 23-29 (Luke 1:68-79)
		Seventh Sunday of Easter	Neither Jew or Greek, slave or free, male and female; one in Christ.
June	8	NL346: Pentecost; Fruits of the Spirit	Acts 2:1-4; Galatians 4:1-7 [5:16-26] (Luke 11:11-13)
		Day of Pentecost	Pentecost; God pours the Spirit into our hearts so we can call on God as Father.
